
In closing, I want to express my gratitude for the opportunity to be the AAMP president and your continued support of the AAMP.



Highlighting Maxillofacial Prosthetic

Craniofacial Center, Chicago Illinois

The Craniofacial Center is one of the oldest and largest facilities in the world dedicated to the evaluation and treatment of cleft lip and palate, as well as other congenital craniofacial conditions, in infants, children, adolescents, and adults. Additionally, it provides surgical, prosthetic and psychosocial rehabilitation for patients with head and neck cancer and those who have experienced craniofacial trauma.

The Craniofacial Center is located on the University of Illinois Medical Center campus in a 16,000square-foot state-of-theart facility. It is part of the Division of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery within the Department of Surgery at the UIC College of Medicine. The Craniofacial Center's team of medical, dental and allied health professionals, which includes plastic and reconstructive surgeons,



maxillofacial prosthodontists, orthodontists, anaplastologists, speech and language pathologist, psychologists, audiologist, pediatrician, and pediatric dentist, works together to provide comprehensive care to patients through its two clinical components, the Maxillofacial Prosthetics Clinic and the Cleft/Craniofacial Clinic. The Maxillofacial Prosthetics Clinic offers rehabilitation for craniofacial patients, or those who have had head and neck cancer surgery or suffered oral or



facial trauma, while the Cleft/Craniofacial Clinic specializes in the evaluation and treatment of congenital craniofacial conditions such as cleft lip and palate, hemifacial microsomia, cranial synostosis, severe jaw discrepancies and malocclusions, and related craniofacial conditions. The Cleft and Craniofacial team is accredited by the American Cleft Palate Craniofacial Association (ACPA). The Craniofacial Center has over 2,000 active patients and receives 500 new patient referrals annually. Throughout its history, the center has treated more than 20,000 patients. Our patients benefit from a personalized treatment environment with access to comprehensive resources of a major urban medical center.

A brief history: The Center was founded in 1949 by orthodontist Dr. Samuel Pruzansky at the University of Illinois Medical Center at Chicago through a grant from the Federal Children's Bureau. Its original mission was to document craniofacial growth in children with cleft lip and palate. Under Dr. Pruzansky's guidance, the center's reputation and referral base expanded across the country and around the world. Dr. Pruzansky recognized the multiple and complex needs of patients and developed the team approach to cleft and craniofacial care. He believed in medical and dental specialists and allied health professionals working together in a single location to provide multidisciplinary, comprehensive care. Today, this team approach is the

hallmark of the Craniofacial Center and has served as a model for other centers in the United States, South America, Europe, and Asia.

By the 1960s, there became a need for a comprehensive program of prosthetic services at The Craniofacial Center. Medical artist, Alice Katz, joined the team to make facial prostheses. This was the first such program of its kind in the world. By 1970, Dr. Henry Gold, one of the premier restorative dentists in Chicago, joined the team to provide specialized care for the complex dental needs of The Center's growing patient population. In addition to caring for patients with congenital cleft and craniofacial conditions, The Clinic began treating patients with head and neck cancer and craniofacial trauma. Dr. Iraj Sooudi was The Center's first maxillofacial prosthodontist and laid the foundation for the growth of Maxillofacial Prosthetics within the center, which has led to its current success in this field.

The Maxillofacial Prosthetics team: The Maxillofacial Prosthetic team includes Dr. David Reisberg and Dr. Akanksha Srivastava, both of whom are board-certified prosthodontists and maxillofacial prosthodontists, as well as senior anaplastologists Rosemary Seelaus and anaplastologist and ocularist Eduardo Arias. The strong collaboration between the MFP and craniofacial surgical teams allows for comprehensive patient care including primary rehabilitation options such as jaw-in-a day treatment. The Maxillofacial Prosthetics Clinic also receives patient referrals from all eleven major medical centers in Chicago and from national and international medical centers. We also enjoy a strong partnership with Shriner's Children Hospital in Chicago, which enables Shriner's patients to receive care at both centers to optimize their outcomes.

Our team is equipped with the latest digital technologies through our robust collaborations with a biomedical engineering team, local vendors, and laboratories. We use virtual reality for surgical planning of all complex cases, including free flap reconstructions, oral and craniofacial implants, in conjunction with widely adopted CAD/CAM technologies. We are currently exploring the integration of augmented reality with robotics and dynamic navigation to further enhance our surgical capabilities, with an eye towards machine learning and AI.

Research and Education: The Craniofacial Center is

dedicated to researching ways to improve the lives of its patients. For more than 50 years, we have collected longitudinal data on growth and development for over 10,000 patients, which forms the basis of our Craniofacial Center Data Bank. This world-renowned collection of craniofacial data has been used for over 1,200 scientific publications and helps us develop new and effective treatment protocols. We are currently undertaking a multi-year project to digitize the entire Data Bank, making it the largest electronic collection of cleft growth and development data in the world, which will be available to other centers. The Center was one of the original 10 sites chosen by P.I. Branemark for the FDA craniofacial implant approval process and has enhanced our reputation for advancing oral and craniofacial implantology. As a part of The University of Illinois Medical Center, the Craniofacial Center has access to the resources of a top-tier academic institution. Our team conducts research in a variety of fields related to cancer treatment-related oral morbidities; oral and craniofacial osseointegrated implants; alveolar bone grafting for cleft patients; customized laryngectomy tubes; quality of life in relation to maxillofacial prostheses; outcomes studies; robotics and dynamic navigation in trauma, orthognathic surgery, distraction osteogenesis, craniofacial implantology; genetic conditions, oral and facial surgical and prosthetic rehabilitation; orofacial orthopedics; infant

feeding; and the speech and psychosocial development of cleft and craniofacial patients.

The Craniofacial Center provides training to predoctoral medical and dental students, residency programs in Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery, and visiting professors. The Center plans to introduce a fellowship in Maxillofacial Prosthetics in the near future. Currently, Drs. Reisberg and Srivastava provide didactic and theoretical training to the UIC Plastic surgery residents, Cook County OMFS residents, and dental residents from Illinois Masonic and NorthShore Hospitals. Dr. Srivastava also maintains a research supervisory role with Dr. Mark Chambers for Oral oncology and maxillofacial prosthetics fellows at MD Anderson Cancer Center.

Outreach and fundraising: Nearly half of The Center's patients come from economically disadvantaged families with little or no insurance coverage. Many of them receive financial support through Public Aid or other governmental

agencies. However, in today's changing health care environment, HMOs, private insurance companies, and government healthcare agencies are reducing or eliminating coverage for many vital patient care services. The Center has also faced elimination of state subsidies, which were used to provide critical services that were not otherwise supported.

In order to provide care to all patients without regard for their ability to pay for services, **Face the Future Foundation**, formerly known as The Advisory Board of the Craniofacial Center, was founded in 1987 by a group of former patients, parents of patients, members of Chicago's business and social communities, and others whose lives have been touched by The Center. The mission of this volunteer board has been to raise funds to preserve and enhance the unique health care services of The Center, to foster the team approach for patient care, and to raise the public's a wareness about craniofacial conditions. The Foundation raises funds through various means to achieve two main goals for The Center: ensure the facility and equipment are state-of-the-art and support direct patient care by professional team members whose services are not always covered by insurance, in order to provide full access to services for all patients. The fundraising methods include capital campaigns, grants, gifts, endowments from patient-focused agencies, healthcare foundations and private citizens, as well as through fundraising events such as its annual gala.
